# A Message From THE CHAIRPERSON

Greetings from The Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center (PYC)!

The third quarter of 2025 marked by diverse initiatives in energy, knowledge, innovation, and social activities that PYC continuously present to support Indonesia's sustainable development.

In August, PYC hosted its flagship biennial event, The PYC International Energy Conference (IEC) 2025, themed "Towards Indonesia Emas 2045: Aligning Energy Security, Economic Growth, and Environmental Sustainability." Held on 22–23 August at Hotel Indonesia Kempinski, the conference gathered over 400 participants from Indonesia and abroad, and brought together stakeholders across sectors. We were honored by the presence of high-ranking officials, including keynote speeches from Mr. Agus Harimurti Yudhoyono (Coordinating Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development, Republic of Indonesia), who highlighted the importance of collaboration to achieve sustainability, and Mr. Yassierli (Minister of Manpower, Republic of Indonesia), who emphasized human capital development in supporting the energy transition.

Further strengthening our knowledge contributions, The Indonesia Journal of Energy (IJE) Vol. 8 No. 2 (August 2025) was officially published, featuring seven new manuscripts addressing strategic issues such as green finance, renewable energy, geothermal utilization, carbon pricing, and clean cooking. In addition, PYC launched its inaugural podcast series titled "Financing the Future of Climate," which explored the challenges and opportunities of climate finance for Indonesia in its transition toward a green economy.

In the field of policy studies, PYC, in collaboration with the UGM Energy Studies Center, organized the 2nd Focus Group Discussion (FGD) of the GRID Study (Governance Reform in Indonesia's Electricity Development) on 17 July 2025. The discussion generated constructive insights on designing an electricity regulator that is transparent, accountable, and conducive to a competitive business climate. In September, PYC also held an FGD on the Potential Integration of CCUS with Green Industries as part of the PYC Drives Indo-CCUS study, in collaboration with the CoE CCS/CCUS ITB and LPEM FEB UI.

Strategic partnerships were also advanced through collaboration with the Kadin Indonesia Institute (KII) in the Policy Advocacy Training held at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy (LKYSPP), NUS, on 24–26 September 2025. The program trained 60 selected participants in policy advocacy, strategic leadership, and ASEAN-level collaboration, serving as a milestone in preparing Indonesia's next generation of adaptive, globally minded leaders.

Moreover, PYC actively engaged in important forums such as Indonesia Green Connect 2025 at ITB, PYC Talks on "The Future of Climate Finance for Indonesia's Energy Transition," as well as delivering guest lectures for the TNI Command and Staff College (Sesko TNI) Regular Education Course LIV, Academic Year 2025, on "Global and National Environmental Dynamics, the Essence of National Defense," and "Defense Policy and Strategy."

On the social and cultural front, PYC once again held the 6th Prof. Purnomo Yusgiantoro Junior Chess Championship as part of our commitment to encourage the younger generation to sharpen critical thinking, sportsmanship, and competitiveness.

Through these activities, PYC reaffirms its commitment to being a center of knowledge, advocacy, and collaboration in the fields of energy, public policy, and community empowerment. We recognize that the challenges of energy transition, green economic development, and the vision of Indonesia Emas 2045 require concrete contributions from all elements of society.

We extend our gratitude to all partners, academics, stakeholders, and communities who have jointly contributed to PYC's initiatives. Moving forward, we hope this synergy will grow even stronger, toward realizing an Indonesia that is competitive, sustainable, and prosperous.

# Prof. Purnomo Yusgiantoro attended the Indonesia Green Connect 2025 event at ITB

Prof. Purnomo Yusgiantoro spoke at the "Indonesia Green Connect 2025" event held in the East Hall of the Institut Teknologi Bandung on 7 August 2025. During the event, Prof. Purnomo spoke on the topic "Resilience Towards Energy Sovereignty." For his presentation, Prof. Purnomo discussed the concepts of Indonesian geopolitics and geostrategy, the current status of Indonesia's energy security, energy sovereignty, and energy resource management.

According to the data from the National Energy Council (DEN), Indonesia's Energy Security Index score in 2024 was 6.64, or nestled in the "secure" category. However, several indicators had low scores. necessitating improvements. Sovereignty is the supreme power held by a country, institution, or individual over a territory, community, or self, without being subject to any higher authority. In the energy context, energy sovereignty is the right of a state and nation to independently determine energy management policies to achieve energy security and independence. There are currently existing regulatory schemes for this, both upstream and downstream.





#### (PYC Drives - GRID) FGD II: In-Depth Study on GRID

The Focus Group Discussion (FGD) of the GRID Study (Governance Reform in Indonesia's Electricity Development to Support Indonesia's OECD Accession) was held on Thursday, 17 July 2025 at the Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center (PYC) Office. This study is a collaborative program between PYC and Pusat Studi Energi, Universitas Gadjah Mada, with the Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs as the beneficiary partner. The event was a continuation of the first FGD held in April, focusing on institutional model options for an electricity regulator, including a fully independent regulator, a semi-independent body, or a special unit within the government structure. The discussion was attended by representatives from the Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources, Bappenas, PT PLN (Persero), electricity associations, private energy companies, as well as experts who shared the same strategic perspectives.

The discussion was conducted interactively and constructively, generating valuable inputs on the key principles and functions of a regulator, challenges in institutional transition, and the relevance of international best practices for Indonesia. The FGD concluded with a shared recognition of the need for a regulator that is accountable, transparent, and free from conflicts of interest, while also able to foster a more competitive business climate. The inputs gathered will serve as the basis for the final GRID Study report, which will be presented in October. Another key objective of this study is to support Indonesia's accession process to the OECD and strengthen the transformation of the electricity sector towards a more efficient, transparent, and competitive system.



On 26 July 2025, the Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center (PYC) in collaboration with the University of Waterloo through the FINCAPES Project, held a PYC Talks event titled "The Future of Climate Financing for Energy Transition in Indonesia." The event aimed to enhance knowledge and understanding of climate financing strategies tailored to Indonesia's green energy transition.

Arnita Rishanty, Senior Economist at Bank Indonesia, opened the discussion by highlighting the central bank's role in supporting inclusive energy transition primarily through promoting green lending and encouraging sustainability reporting among potential borrowers.

Paul Butarbutar, Head of the JETP Indonesia Secretariat, discussed recent developments following the US withdrawal from the partnership and outlined future strategies for ensuring a just energy transition.

Yudha Permana Jayadikarta, Executive Director of METI, emphasized the importance of renewable energy industries in accessing and accelerating climate finance via Public-Private Partnership (PPP) schemes.

Luky A. Yusgiantoro, member of PYC's Board, stressed that climate financing is a crucial force for national energy transition and that such forums serve as a bridge between government, finance institutions, industry, and academia.

Michael Lynch, FINCAPES Project Field Director, underlined the importance of collaboration to achieve Indonesia's Net Zero Emissions (NZE) target by 2060—highlighting this initiative as a key for stepping forward.

The event was closed by PYC's Head of Supervisory Board, Inka B. Yusgiantoro. He stated that while climate financing remains challenging, solutions can emerge through cross sector collaboration supported by inclusive policies.



#### **PYC International Energy Conference Day 1**

The International Energy Conference (IEC) is a biennial event organized by PYC. This year, the IEC carries the theme "Towards Indonesia Emas 2045: Aligning Energy Security, Economic Growth, and Environmental Sustainability." The series of activities took place on 22-23 August 2025, at the Kempinski Hotel, Indonesia.

On the first day, PYC, in collaboration with the University of Waterloo under the FINCAPES Project funded by the Government of Canada, launched the Center of Excellence for Climate Finance Policy Research, Education, and Training, "RECLICKS," aimed at strengthening the climate finance policy framework in Indonesia, particularly related to the energy sector. The Canadian Ambassador to Indonesia, H.E. Jess Dutton, was also present to deliver his remarks and warmly welcome this collaboration. The day also featured a CLICKS Talk session with Jeffrey Wilson, Associate Professor at the University of Waterloo, as the keynote speaker. The program continued with presentations from the Top 10 finalists of the Call for Paper Competition, who had undergone multiple stages of selection since January 2025.

Meanwhile, on the second day, which was attended by 415 participants, several high-level officials were invited to deliver presentations in both plenary and parallel sessions. The event was opened with welcoming remarks from the PYC Chairwoman, Filda C. Yusqiantoro, who emphasized that this year's IEC theme reflects the moment when the nation is preparing for the remaining 20 years before celebrating its centennial independence as a nation. This was followed by an opening speech from Special Advisor to the President for Energy sector, Purnomo Yusgiantoro. Coordinating Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development, Agus Harimurti Yudhoyono (AHY), delivered the keynote speech, stressing that collaboration among -stakeholders is key to achieving sustainability, and IEC could catalyse progress by bringing together key actors. Minister of Manpower, Yassierli, also delivered a keynote speech highlighting the importance of human resource capacity building in supporting the energy transition.



plenary session was moderated by Suryo Pratomo, Indonesian Ambassador to Singapore. In this session, Matthew David Johnson-Idan (United Nations), Xiaowei Liu (World Energy Council), Achmad Faisal Suralaga (BKPM), and Agung Wicaksono (Pertamina) highlighted the importance of balancing energy security, economic growth, and environmental sustainability as key factors in creating inclusive and sustainable development aligned with the vision of Indonesia Emas 2045.

The program then continued with parallel sessions, where participants were divided into three rooms. The first room carried the theme "Sustainable Energy as a Catalyst for Green Growth". This session was moderated by Filda C. Yusgiantoro with five speakers: Togu Pardede (Bappenas), Anindya Bakrie (Kadin), Ming Ongkwang (Halliburton), Yinlung Teng (IEA), and Achmed S. Edianto (UNOPS).

In the second room, with the theme "Green Energy Financing," Head of PYC Supervisory Board, Inka B. Yusgiantoro, moderated the discussion featuring Darwin Cyril Noerhadi (Indonesia Investment Authority/INA), Peter du Pont (Asia Clean Energy Partners), Hakimul Batih (OECD – CEFIM), and lanto Jones (Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office).

Meanwhile, the third room, moderated by PYC Advisory Board Member, Luky A. Yusgiantoro, discussed the theme "Workforce Development." Speakers included Ananda Alonso Nacher (International Labour Organization/ILO), Ruly Marianti (GESIT Project), Amalia Adininggar Widyasanti (Head of Statistics Indonesia/BPS), and I Dewa Gede Karma Wisana (Universitas Indonesia).



#### FGD I for PYC Drives Indo-CCUS

The Focus Group Discussion (FGD) with the theme "Potential Integration of CCUS with Green Industry in Hard-to-Abate Industries" was held on Monday, 22 September 2025, in a hybrid format at the PYC office. This FGD was organized to support one of PYC Drives' studies, "Indo-CCUS: Integration of CCS, CCUS, and CCU in the Implementation of Carbon Markets and the Transition Towards Low-Emission Industries," in collaboration with the Center of Excellence (CoE) CCS/CCUS, ITB and the Institute for Economic and Social Research (LPEM), Faculty of Economics and Business, Universitas Indonesia (FEB UI).

Massita Ayu Cindy, PYC Researcher, acted as the moderator of this FGD. The discussion began with a presentation from Agsha, S.T., M.Sc., Ph.D., representing the CoE CCS/CCUS ITB team. This was followed by presentations from Mamik Cahyono, representing the Directorate General of Oil & Gas, Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources; Fausan Arif, from the Green Industry Center, Ministry of Industry; and Gatot Setiawan, from the Directorate of Climate Change Mitigation, Ministry of Environment and Forestry.

The session then continued with responses from FGD participants representing various industrial sectors, such as the Indonesia Cement Association (ASI), Indonesian Pulp and Paper Association (APKI), Indonesia Iron & Steel Industry Association (IISIA), PT Rekayasa Industri, PT Petrokimia Gresik, PT Petro Oxo Nusantara, and the Chemical Engineering Division of the Institution of Engineers Indonesia (BKKPII).

#### Social **Initiatives**



On 30 August 2025, The Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center (PYC), in collaboration with the Indonesian Chess Association (PERCASI), successfully held the 6th Junior Chess Championship at the Gelora Bung Karno Multipurpose Hall, Jakarta. The tournament brought together 160 young players: 61 participants in the under-9 category and 99 in the under-11 category, representing not only Greater Jakarta but also regions across Java, Yogyakarta, and as far as Bandar Lampung.

The opening remarks were delivered by Inka B. Yusgiantoro, Chair of PYC's Board of Supervisors, who emphasized the role of chess in shaping resilience, competitiveness, and sportsmanlike young generations. This was followed by Rear Admiral Abdul Riva'i Ras, Vice Chairman of PERCASI, who reaffirmed the association's commitment to supporting youth development as part of Indonesia's national chess program. He highlighted the importance of fostering both character and skills in order to create athletes with strong achievements.

The Minister of Youth and Sports, Dito Ariotedjo, underlined that chess does not only teaches game techniques but also instills intelligence, courage, confidence, and strategic thinking; which are all considered valuable qualities for future education and careers, whether in sports or other professions.

The championship was officially opened with symbolic pawn moves by the Minister and Prof. Purnomo Yusgiantoro, marking a step forward in nurturing Indonesia's future chess talents.

# Signing of Memorandum of Agreement between Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center and Kadin Indonesia Institute

The Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center (PYC) and Kadin Indonesia Institute (KII) have officially signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) for the Policy Advocacy Training Program. This signing marks an important milestone in the strategic collaboration to deliver the program in partnership with the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy (LKYSPP), National University of Singapore (NUS).

The signing ceremony was attended and witnessed by Purnomo Yusgiantoro (Founder of PYC), Filda C. Yusgiantoro (Chairperson of PYC), Dato' Low Tuck Kwong (President Director of PT Bayan Resources), Alexander E. Wibowo (Director of PT Bayan Resources), Mulya Amri (Executive Director of Kadin Institute), and Erwin Aksa (Supervisor of Kadin Indonesia).

The training program will be held on 24–26 September 2025 in Singapore, involving 60 selected KADIN members. The participants will include both national-level leaders and distinguished representatives from provinces across Indonesia, who will be trained in policy analysis, advocacy, and strategic leadership.

The program aims to strengthen Indonesia's public policy advocacy capacity through comprehensive training with LKYSPP, incorporating global perspectives and innovative learning methods.

This initiative is designed to enhance the country's policy advocacy capabilities and foster the development of human resources capable of supporting national development policies, particularly those focused on driving economic growth.

#### **Purnomo Yusgiantoro Courtesy Call to The Minister of Marine Affairs and Fisheries**

In 22 July 2025, The Founder of the Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center, Purnomo Yusgiantoro visited the Ministry of Marine Affairs and Fisheries (MMAF) and was granted an audience with the Minister himself, Sakti Wahyu Trenggono. The discussion centered on Indonesia's commitment to advancing the Blue Economy. Sakti Wahyu Trenggono conveyed that the Blue Economy Roadmap has been prepared as a national strategic guideline. Within this framework, food security is regarded as a multidimensional issue that must maintain a balance across three key nutritional components: carbohydrates, fats, and proteins. In this context, blue food holds a vital position, particularly as a high-value and sustainable source of animal protein in the global food system.

The dialogue also highlighted pressing challenges and emerging opportunities. Sakti Wahyu Trenggono underlined the importance of strengthening the supply chain, including upstream industries and storage facilities, to secure the resilience and affordability of seafood. Climate change impacts—ranging from the melting of the glaciers to the rising of sea temperatures—were recognized as serious threats that require swift and innovative responses. Indonesia can also draw valuable lessons from the advanced practices of countries such as Japan and Vietnam, especially in sustainable fisheries management and blue food innovation. This visit was part of the preparations for the International Food Security Conference, which will be hosted by PYC in 2026



#### **Courtesy Call to the Minister of Foreign Affairs**

IOn 24 July 2025, a meeting was held with the Minister of Foreign Affairs Sugiono, attended by the Directorate General of Multilateral Cooperation Tri Tharyat, the Director of Trade, Industry, Commodities, and Intellectual Property Ditya Agung Nurdianto, Purnomo Yusgiantoro, Filda C. Yusgiantoro, and Deputy for Geoeconomics Yayat Ruyat. In this meeting, Purnomo conveyed PYC's initiative to support Asta Cita 2 on Food Security through organizing the International Food Security Conference (IFSC). Sugiono advised that the Director General of Multilateral Cooperation should join the Steering Committee and also suggested adjusting the event timeline in consideration of the dense international agenda, including the ASEAN Summit, the APEC meeting, and the World Food Forum.

This meeting marked an important step in the preparations for IFSC 2026, which will be hosted by PYC. With the guidance and support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, IFSC 2026 is expected to be organized with better preparation, providing a platform for Indonesia to contribute strategically to both national and global food security issues. Importantly, the conference also aims to open and strengthen international food security networks, positioning Indonesia as a key actor in global food cooperation.



#### Public Lecture for the Officers of the Regular Education Program (Dikreg) LIV Sesko TNI, Academic Year 2025

On Thursday, 7 August 2025, The Founder of the Purnomo Yusgiantoro Center (PYC), Purnomo Yusgiantoro, delivered a public lecture to the officers of the Regular Education Program (Dikreg) LIV at the Indonesian National Armed Forces Command and Staff College (Sesko TNI), Academic Year 2025. In his lecture, Purnomo provided an in-depth discussion on "Global and National Dynamics, the Essence of National Defense, and Strategies for Defense Policy". He highlighted that the shifting global geopolitical order, the rivalry among major powers, rapid advancements in military technology, as well as nontraditional challenges such as cybersecurity, energy security, and maritime security, must be addressed through adaptive and well-calibrated policies. The lecture not only offered theoretical perspectives but also drew upon the empirical experiences of a distinguished figure with an extensive track record in defense, energy, and public policy. The insights presented provided strategic knowledge for Sesko TNI officers to sharpen their analytical skills, strengthen leadership capacity, and refine their vision in fulfilling the mandate of safeguarding the sovereignty and security of the Republic of Indonesia in the years to come.
